School Performance

TEACHER QUALITY

The majority of our teachers (70%) have continued their education and achieved higher degrees. Nine teachers are National Board Certified. One teacher recently completed a doctoral degree. On an average, our teachers have been here 12.9 years. The percentage of teachers who returned to Mountain View from last year is 93.5%. All classroom teachers currently meet the "highly qualified" requirements as specified by No Child Left Behind.

SCHOOL CLIMATE

Our school climate continues to be a strength here at Mountain View. As a three-time Red Carpet recipient, we pride ourselves on our warm and positive environment. According to our 2012 Report Card Survey 94.4% of our parents are satisfied with the learning environment here at Mountain View. We will continue in our efforts to maintain that culture.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

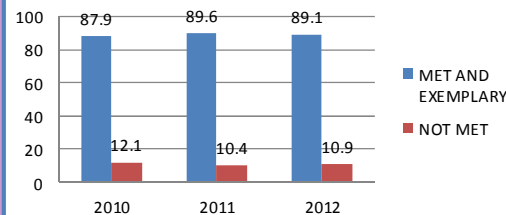

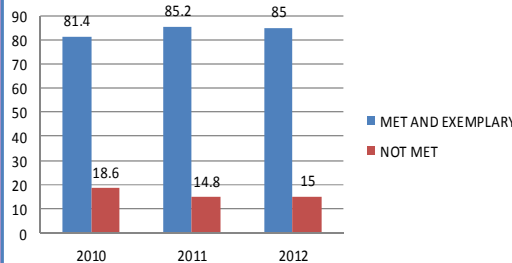


ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS OVER TIME



Over the past three years, Mountain View students are remaining steady in their proficiency in English Language Arts as measured by PASS. The percentage of students scoring MET and EXEMPLARY is currently 89.1%.

MATH OVER TIME



The percentage of students scoring MET or EXEMPLARY in Math as measured by the PASS is also remaining steady at 85%.

Performance Goals

PERFORMANCE GOAL 1: The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary on the PASS English Language Arts test will increase from 84% in 2008-09 to 96.8% in 2012-13.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 2: The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary on the PASS Math test will increase from 80% in 2008-09 to 96% in 2012-13.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 3: The percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary on the PASS Writing test will increase from 79.4% in 2008-09 to 96.8% in 2012-13.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 4: The percentage of classes taught by Highly Qualified teachers will remain at 100%.

PERFORMANCE GOAL 5: The percentage of parents who are satisfied with the learning environment at Mountain View will increase from 95.6% to 99.6% as reported on the annual report card.
