PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We will continue to develop our strategies using the Fountas and Pinnell approach to reading instruction. We will also continue to polish our skills as a Project Read school, using strategies we have gained through our graduate studies, to help our children become better readers and writers. Additionally, we offer continuing professional development in the area of technology to maintain proficiency in the latest devices and software applications.

TEACHER QUALITY

The majority of our teachers (78%) have continued their education and achieved advanced degrees. Six teachers are National Board Certified. One teacher completed a doctoral degree and another an educational specialist degree. Three more are working toward a doctorate. The percentage of teachers who returned to Mountain View from last year is 96.1%. Teacher attendance rate is 90.5%. All classroom teachers are Highly Qualified.

STUDENT PROGRESS

According to the 2018-2019 Report Card Survey, Mountain View received a 34.8 out of 40 for student progress. Teachers and staff diligently seek ways to meet the needs of students. Our teachers want to see students grow and succeed.

SCHOOL CLIMATE

Our school climate continues to be a strength here at Mountain View. As a three-time Red Carpet recipient, we pride ourselves on our warm and positive environment. According to our 2018-2019 Report Card Survey 97% of our parents and teachers and 95.7% of our students are satisfied with the learning environment here at Mountain View. We will continue in our efforts to maintain that culture.



Mountain View's percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary on SCReady ELA for 2019 was 68.9%, higher than the district average of 54.7%. We will continue to update our strategies for teaching reading, writing and language to increase student performance level.

The percentage of students scoring MET or EXEMPLARY in Math as measured by the SCReady is currently 67.4%, surpassing the district average of 54.5%.

Teachers continue to prepare students for standardized testing by using the MasteryConnect program. This tool gives teachers information on current student levels three time per year in order to better meet the needs of individual children.
