## School Performance

### TEACHER QUALITY

The majority of our teachers (72.7%) have continued their education and achieved advanced degrees. Nine teachers are National Board Certified. One teacher recently completed a doctoral degree and another an educational specialist degree. On an average, our teachers have been here 12.9 years. The percentage of teachers who returned to Mountain View from last year is 95.9%. Teacher attendance rate is 91.3%. All classroom teachers currently meet the "highly qualified" requirements.

### SCHOOL CLIMATE

Our school climate continues to be a strength here at Mountain View. As a three-time Red Carpet recipient, we pride ourselves on our warm and positive environment. According to our 2014 Report Card Survey 91% of our parents and 97% of our teachers are satisfied with the learning environment here at Mountain View. We will continue in our efforts to maintain that culture.

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

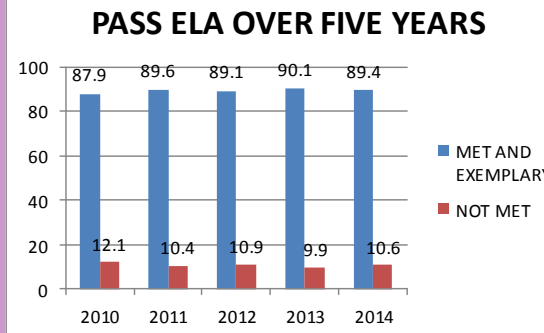

We will also continue to polish our skills as a Project Read school, using strategies we have gained through our graduate studies, to help our children become better readers and writers. Additionally, we offer continuing professional development in the area of technology to maintain proficiency in the latest devices and software applications.

### STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

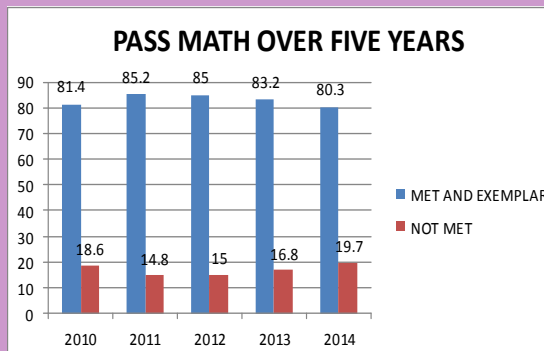
Mountain View Elementary has continued to make gains in student achievement over the last five years. Our Absolute Rating on the 2014 Annual School Report Card was "Excellent", meaning our school's performance substantially exceeds state standards. This change of rating earned us the Palmetto Gold Award. Our student achievement, as measured by PASS exceed the district average in all tested subjects.



Mountain View's percentage of students scoring Met and Exemplary on SCPASS ELA for 2012 was 89.4%, which is significantly higher than the district average of 78.6%. We will continue to use current strategies in addition to implementing the Balanced Literacy approach to maintain that performance level.



The percentage of students scoring MET or EXEMPLARY in Math as measured by the SCPASS dipped slightly in 2014, from 83.2% to 80.3%.
