The PTA and SIC (School Improvement Council), as well as parent and community volunteers have contributed to the school, meeting many goals as it has expanded its programs over the last few years. Volunteers contribute their time in the classroom, in before-school programs, and at special events.

Raising student academic achievement is a top priority. We identify students needing extra assistance in reading in the early grades and provide a small group tutorial program, called RTI. We also provide a before-school computer based math program, called Larson's Math, for older students. This program is supported by our local volunteers who faithfully run the lab each morning.

Our school will continue to identify educational needs and work constantly toward improving the educational opportunities offered. Through the dedication and high expectations of the administration, faculty, staff, and families, the Simpsonville Elementary School community can expect continued academic and instructional growth of students. Students have shown growth each year for the past 5 years on state-wide testing. Members of the community are invited to take an active role in our educational program.
