AFHS is a member of the High Schools That Work network. This gives us access to numerous opportunities for professional growth and best practices for student achievement.

- Students continue to participate in Gear Up and Upward Bound activities through South Carolina State University.
- The Freshman Academy has been implemented to provide a smooth transition for students moving from middle school to high school.
- A partnership with Denmark Technical College afforded students the opportunity to enroll in a course offered through the college.
- Students who have taken AP English have an opportunity to take English 101 at USC Salkehatchie.
- Our athletic department continues to be strong in all sports including football, volleyball, basketball, softball, baseball, and track.
- We now offer Teacher Cadet to seniors interested in teaching as a profession.
- A Data Room was developed to assist teachers in analyzing student data.

Student Achievement Goals

AFHS is a Palmetto Priority School. In an effort to increase student achievement, we have established and have outlined goals in our Plan of Action. Based on our student achievement goals, we project an increase in student performance on End of Course tests and HSAP. *Students must pass HSAP in order to receive a state diploma.*

Student Achievement Goals

1. By May 2, 2012, 66% of the English/Language Arts students will earn a score of 70% or higher required to pass EOCEP and/or will make a score of level two or higher on HSAP.
2. By May 2, 2012, 50% of first attempt test takers in math will score at Level 2 or higher on HSAP or 70% or higher on EOCEP.

Activities and Strategies for Achievement

- Implement a Freshman Academy to provide a more structured learning environment.
- Ensure that the SDE S3 Curriculum is implemented with fidelity.
- Schedule all ninth graders a Reading and Writing Strategies class in addition to their English I class.
- Provide an after-school tutoring program to offer academic assistance three days weekly.
- Targeting students who are 5 points within 209 RTI score and providing supplemental assistance.
- Schedule all ninth graders a Math Strategies Class in addition to their Algebra I class.
- Targeting students who are 5 points within 223 RTI score in Math and providing them assistance.
