Student Achievement Goals

AFHS is a Palmetto Priority School. In an effort to increase student achievement, we have established goals. Based on our student achievement goals, we project an increase in student performance on End of Course, ACT, and WorkKeys.

- 1. Decrease discipline referrals by fifteen percent (15%) annually.
- 2. Increase the average ACT score by five points annually.
- 3. Increase the percentage of students who meet Platinum, Gold, or Silver on ACT WorkKeys by at least fifteen (15%) annually in Applied Mathematics, at least five (5%) in Reading for Information, and at least ten (10%) in Locating Information.
- 4. Increase the End of Course --- by fifteen (15%) annually in Algebra 1, Biology, English 1 and US History and Constitution.

Activities and Strategies for Achievement

- Develop and revise grades 9-12 curriculum guides with state standards for English Language Arts, Mathematics, and other content areas.
- Use formative assessments data to guide instruction in English Language Arts, Mathematics, and other content areas.
- Infuse technology and problem-based learning into instruction.
- On-going Professional Development for faculty and staff.
- Continue to administer NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) and Mastery Connect assessments at least twice each year in grades nine and ten.
- Continue to implement an effective Credit Recovery Program beyond the regular school.
- Provide virtual courses to increase course offerings.
- Continue to provide a system of extra-help by revising the afterschool program to focus on student achievement.
- Provide Career Ready 101 access to students.
