




Be A Falcon —

Our school-wide focus on STEAM begins August, 2014 -- STEAM is an educational design that incorporates the practices of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, strategically linked with the Arts and Humanities. Learning at Sevier will engage students in meaningful challenges, investigations, and projects that advance critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication.

What makes it STEAM?

- Rigorous Curriculum is the Foundation (What students must know and be able to do)
- Project-Based Learning (PBL) is the Vehicle (How we take them there)
- STEAM is the *Focus of Instruction* (Integrated content learning through the "lens" and practices of Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Math)



With increasing frequency, teachers will implement instruction that centers around a *driving question* that students must answer through a structured process of *project-based learning*. Teachers will collaborate to deliver instruction that crosses content areas and supports student engagement as they work together to learn significant content and solve real-world problems.
