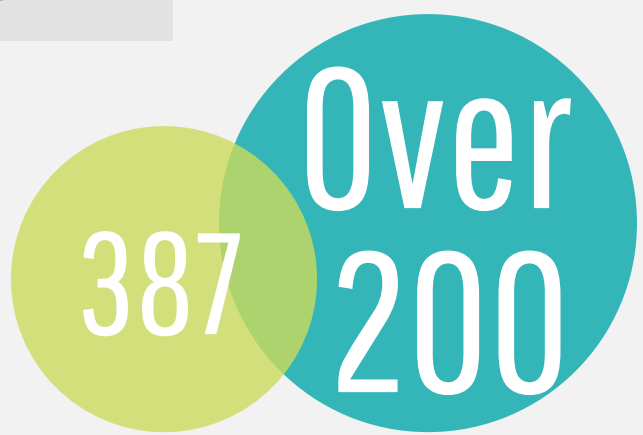

According to state reported data, Tanglewood Middle School improved from 13% in 2015-16 (first year for SCREADY), to 18.4% in 2018-19. Before exiting for COVID-19, benchmark scores projected a 25% proficiency on the math assessment.

According to state reported data, Tanglewood Middle School improved from 15.7% in 2015-16 (first year for SCREADY), to 21.8% in 2018-19. Before exiting for COVID-19, benchmark scores projected a 25% proficiency on the ELA assessment.

- Student Government was trained in trauma and resilience and implemented the first ever student emotional support group daily for peers

On Track Greenville & Other Partnerships

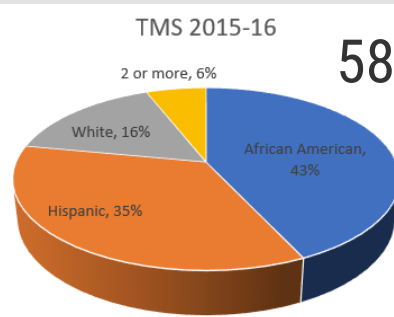
On Track Greenville provided supports via:

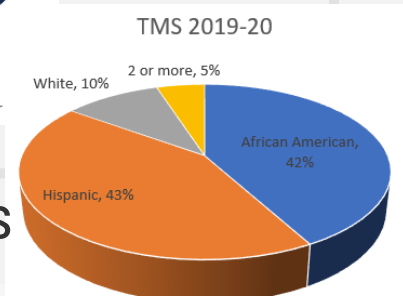
Demographics Data
