Our academic goals remain the same each year. The staff strives to enable all students to master the South Carolina State Standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The results of our most recent state assessments rank our school as one of the district's and state's top elementary schools in English Language Arts, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics.

Our goals for the SC Ready state assessments in grades 3-5 call for the percentage of students Meeting/Exceeding expectations on **Math** will increase from 79% to 82% and for the percentage of students Meeting/Exceeding expectations on **English Language Arts** to increase from 76% to 79%.

We have a number of strategies in place to differentiate instruction and to help all of our students reach their academic potential. Typical strategies that are seen in all classrooms include: Triple I+ (immediate intensive intervention or remediation) based on students' demonstrated needs, flexible small group instruction in both math and reading, opportunities for independent practice utilizing personal devices, and specific whole-group instruction based on the needs of the, additional support from entire class. Additional support is provided by PTA's Bobcat Brain Builders, SIC's Early Risers' Club, Riverside High School Service Learning Students and Teacher Cadets.
