## Academic Goals

Our academic goals remain the same each year. The staff strives to enable all students to master the South Carolina State Standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The results of our most recent state assessments rank our school as one of the district's and state's top elementary schools in English Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies and Mathematics.

Our goals for the SC Ready state assessments in grades 3-5 call for the percentage of students Meeting/Exceeding expectations on **math** will increase from 82% to 85% and for the percentage of students Meeting/Exceeding expectations on **English language arts** to increase from 77% to 80%.

In an effort to enhance our ELA instruction and student achievement and to motivate us as readers, our SIC has lead an initiative to focus efforts from all stakeholders on building a stronger community of literacy. Pieces of this initiative included a book drive to provide books for our Backpack Buddies program, a family and community online book club sponsored by one of our teachers, a social media campaign linked to #for the love of reading, a March Madness book competition at all grade levels, early learning materials provided for incoming K5 students by our SIC, participation in the Battle of the Books sponsored by our Media Specialist and our Literacy Specialist. As part of this initiative, the administration of the school has proactively supplemented our classroom libraries and our literacy instructional resources. Professional Development in balanced literacy has also been a school-wide focus this year.
