School Demographics

Westcliffe Elementary is located in the Berea area of Greenville County, SC, near Furman University. Westcliffe currently serves approximately 315 students from four year old Kindergarten to fifth grade. Faculty and staff strive each day to provide the foundation children need to become life-long learners.

Daily instruction is standards based and data driven. Teachers utilize Fountas & Pinnell, standardized tests, Mastery Connect and common assessments to differentiate instruction to meet student needs. Students is grades 3-5 are tested annually on the SC READY assessment for ELA and Math. Students in grades four and five are tested annually through the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards, or SCPASS test on Science and or Social Studies. Students in grades 2 & 5 are tested annually through the MAP Growth Assessment.

As a Title I School, we receive extra funding to provide teachers to reduce class size, a Response to Intervention teacher, Professional Development for teachers, as well as classroom and parent involvement supplies.
