Woodland Elementary School is fully accredited by the *AdvancED Accreditation Commission* and proudly serves 1108 students in grades pre-kindergarten through fifth from a wide variety of cultural backgrounds. We are currently the largest elementary school in Greenville County Schools with a poverty index of 36% (according to the most recent data from the SC State Department of Education). All members of our professional teaching staff are 'highly qualified' and well trained for the position they hold. Eight of our teachers are National Board Certified and over 67% hold a *Master's Degree* or higher. Our teachers work diligently to arrange experiences that engage students in creative, rigorous, standards-based learning experiences that enable them to achieve to their highest potential. In addition to providing a *rigorous state standards-based curriculum* pre-k through fifth grade and utilizing research-based best practices throughout our instructional program, Woodland continues to promote student achievement through the integration of technology and the arts. Our staff regularly analyzes common formative and summative assessment data to make necessary adjustments to our instructional strategies that support success for every student and meet the unique learning needs of our children. As a Leader in Me Lighthouse School, leadership is embedded in all areas of school life and strengthens students' abilities to lead and take responsibility, evaluate their own progress, set goals, and make plans to achieve these goals. Our students also demonstrate continuous progress academically, participate confidently, and contribute meaningfully with ideas and opportunities that matter not only to them but to our school. Students have developed leadership "soft skills" in the academic setting and are now applying them in other aspects of their lives. As a school, we continue to see our students grow and develop the necessary self-confidence skills and attitudes to be successful leaders of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

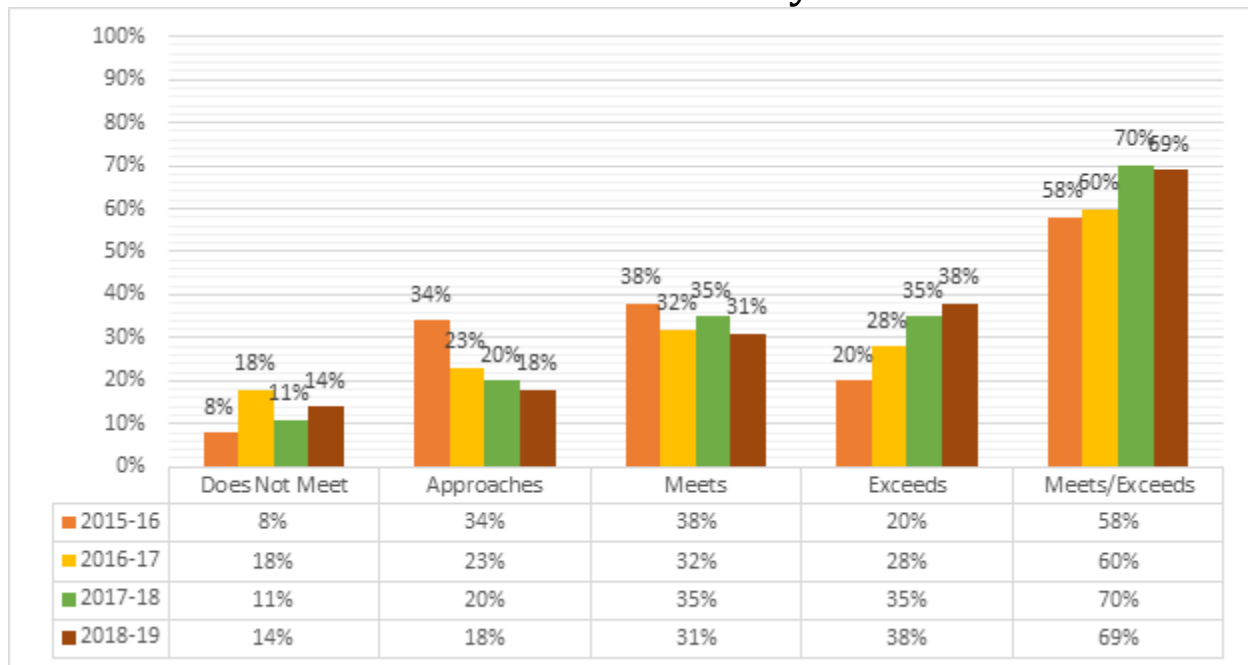
We are extremely proud of the academic achievement growth our students have made in past years and continue to make. We are most appreciative of the continued dedication of our teachers, staff, students, and parents in their efforts to meet the developmental and academic needs of each child. Woodland met the criteria necessary to receive an 'excellent' school rating on the SC state Report Card for the second year in a row. Woodland also received the Palmetto Gold award for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years. Woodland students consistently perform higher than other Greenville County Schools on state assessment measures. Moving forward, our challenge is to continue to refine our implementation of more rigorous grade level standards and effective instructional strategies to sustain our progress and meet the unique learning needs of our children as we continue to increase student achievement. ***A summary of our most recent student achievement data is included in this report.***

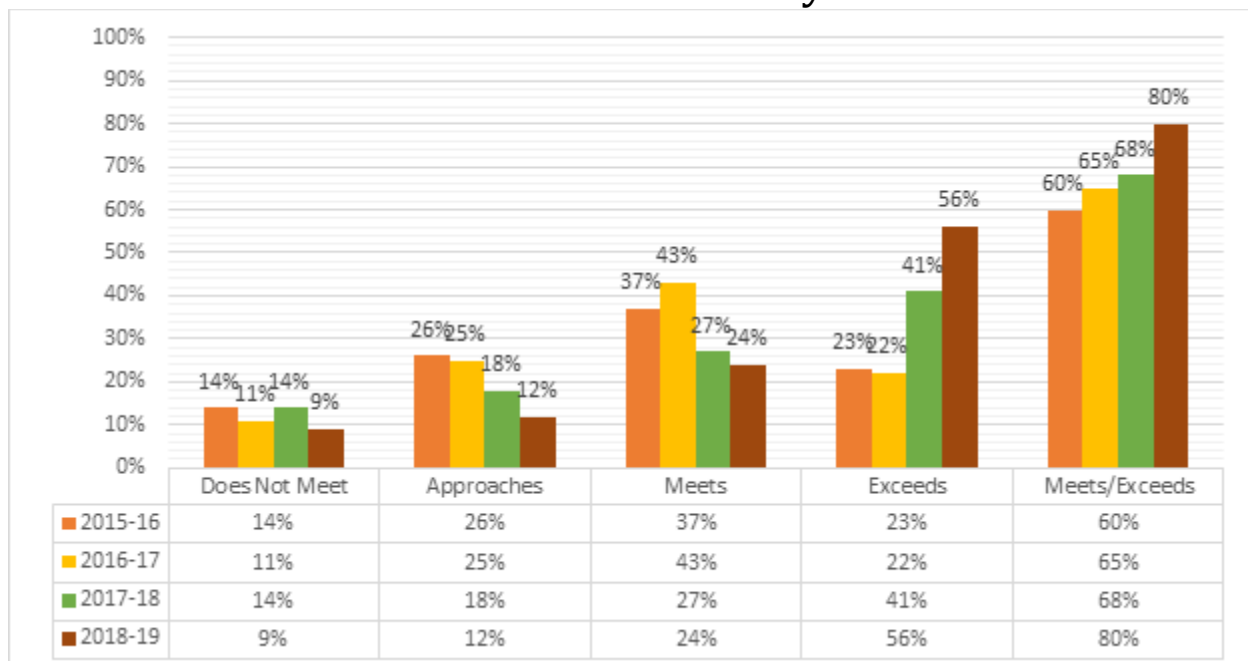

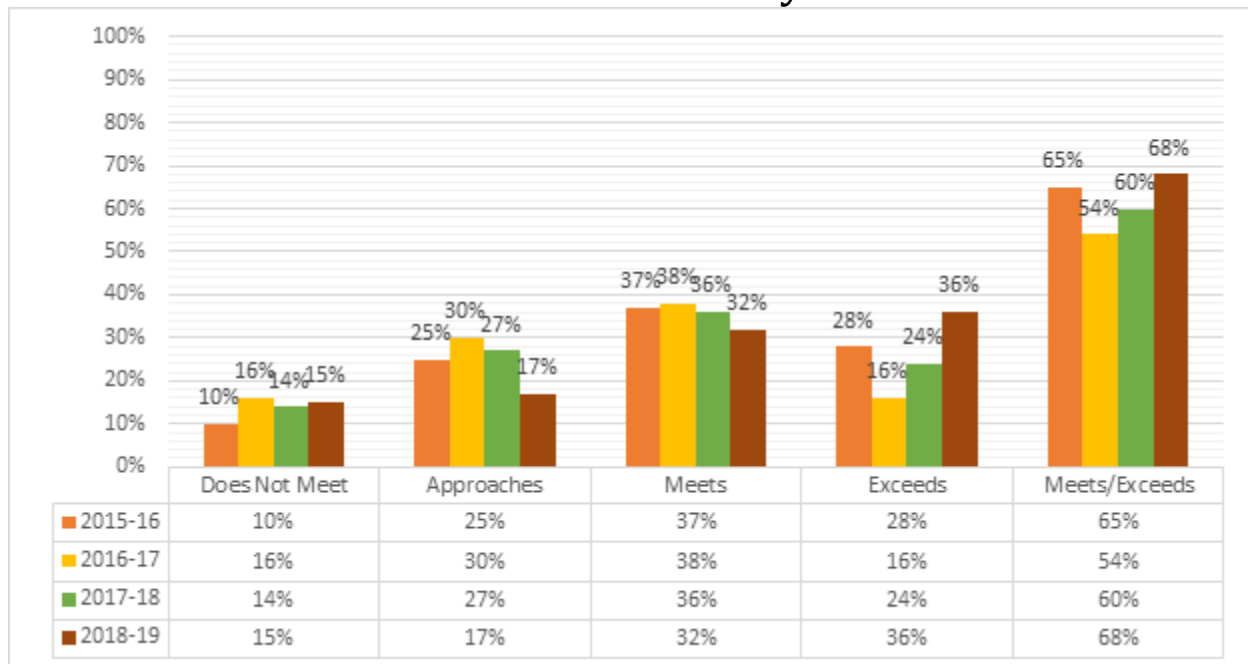

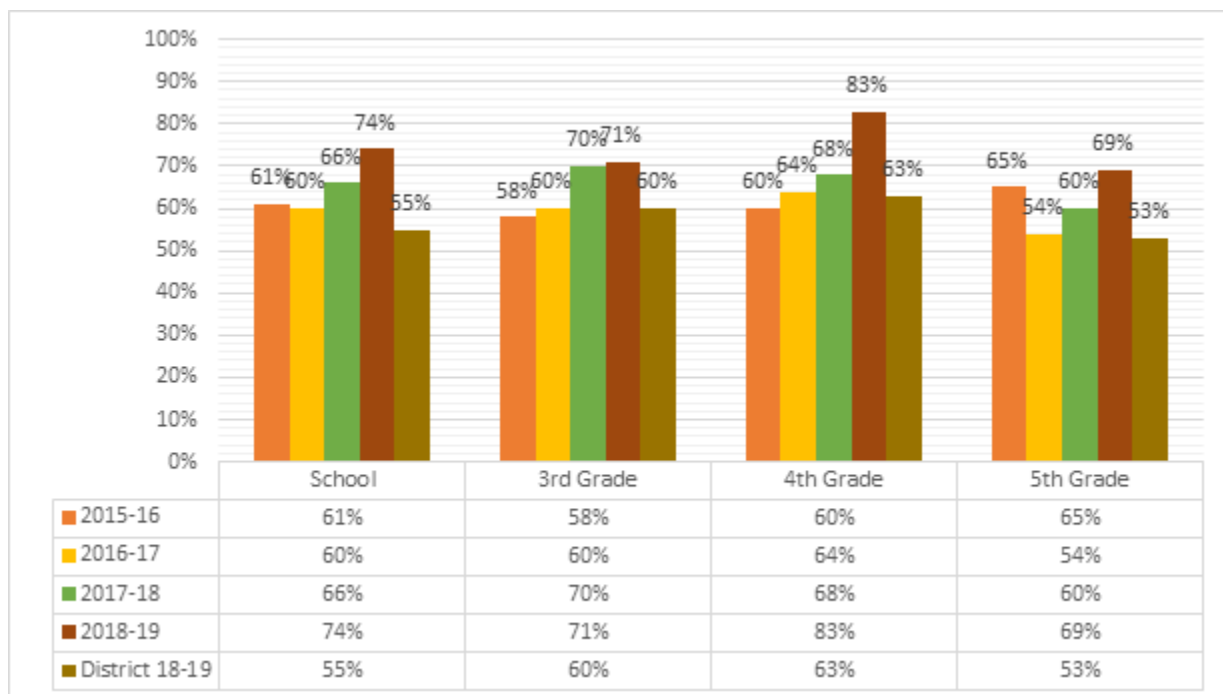
## **Fourth Grade: SC Ready ELA**



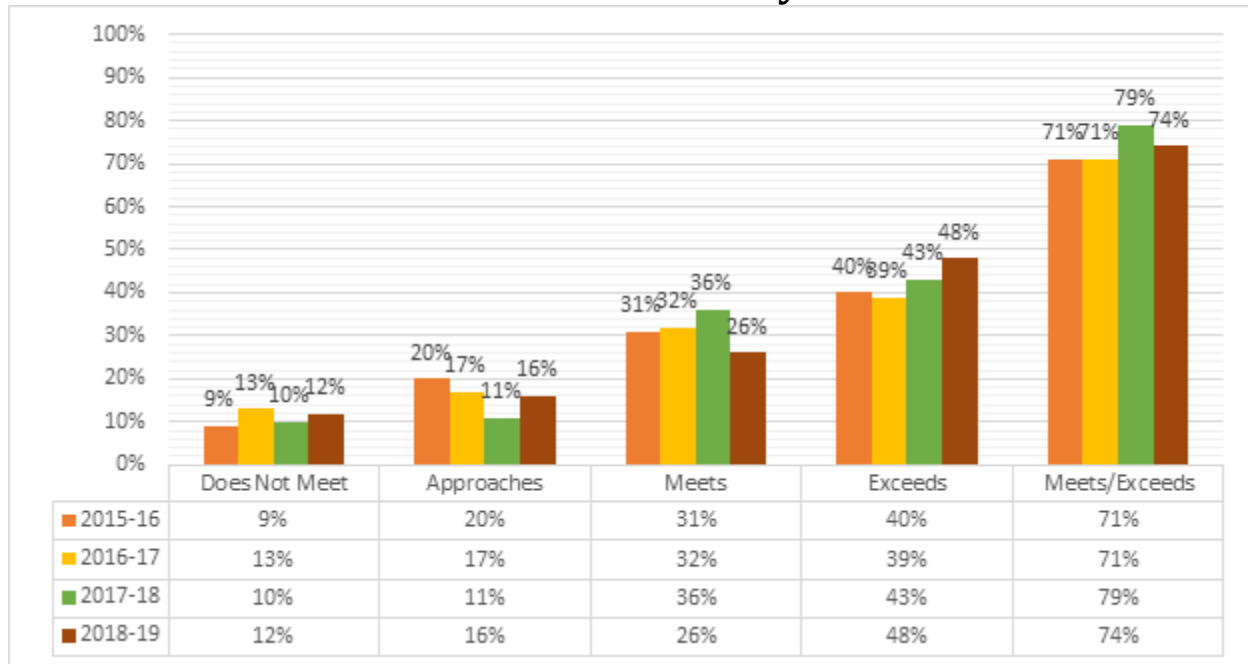
## Fifth Grade: SC Ready ELA



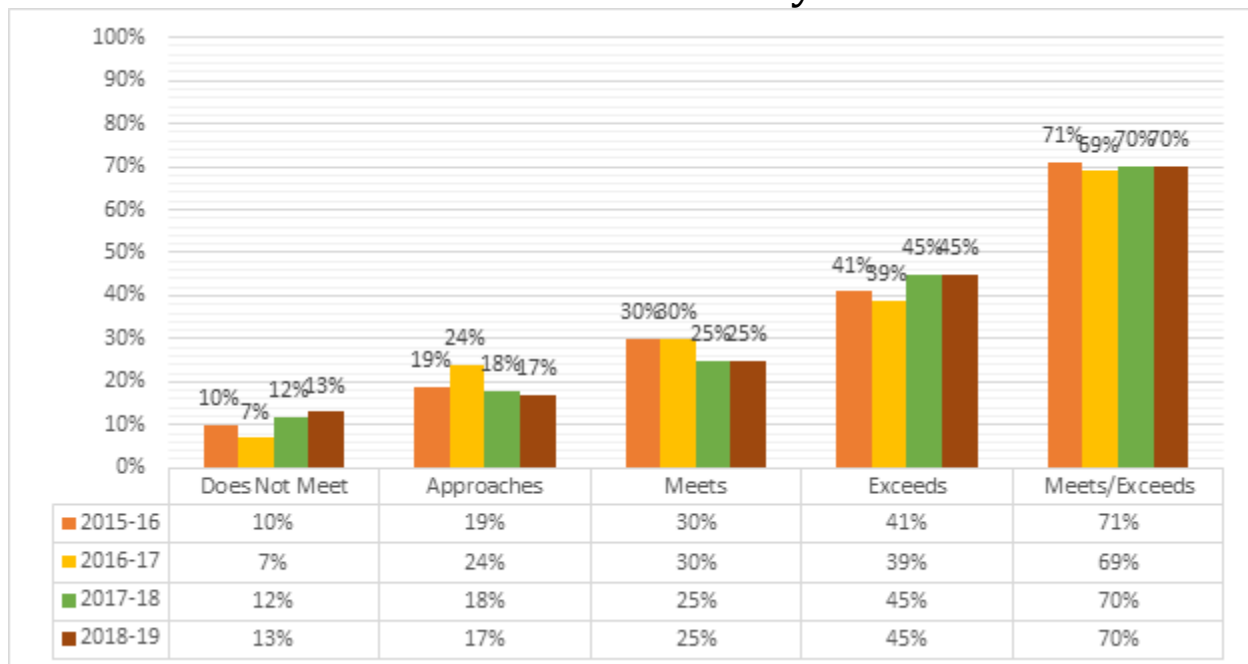
## Woodland vs District: SC Ready ELA



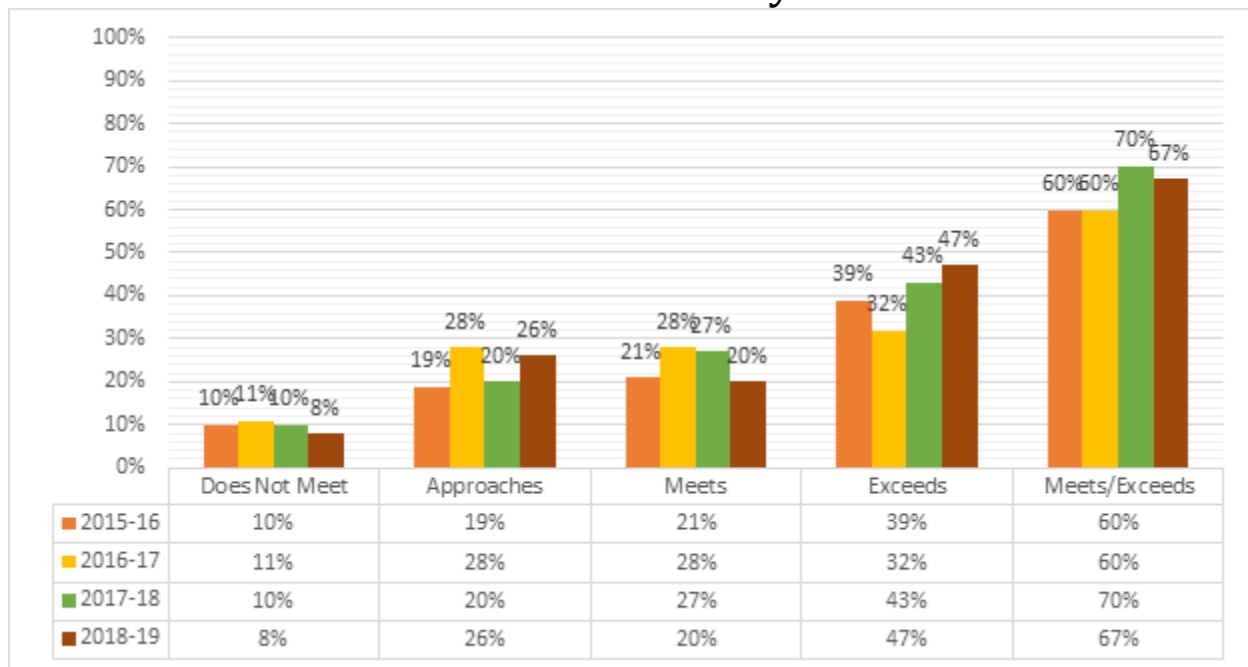
## Third Grade: SC Ready Math



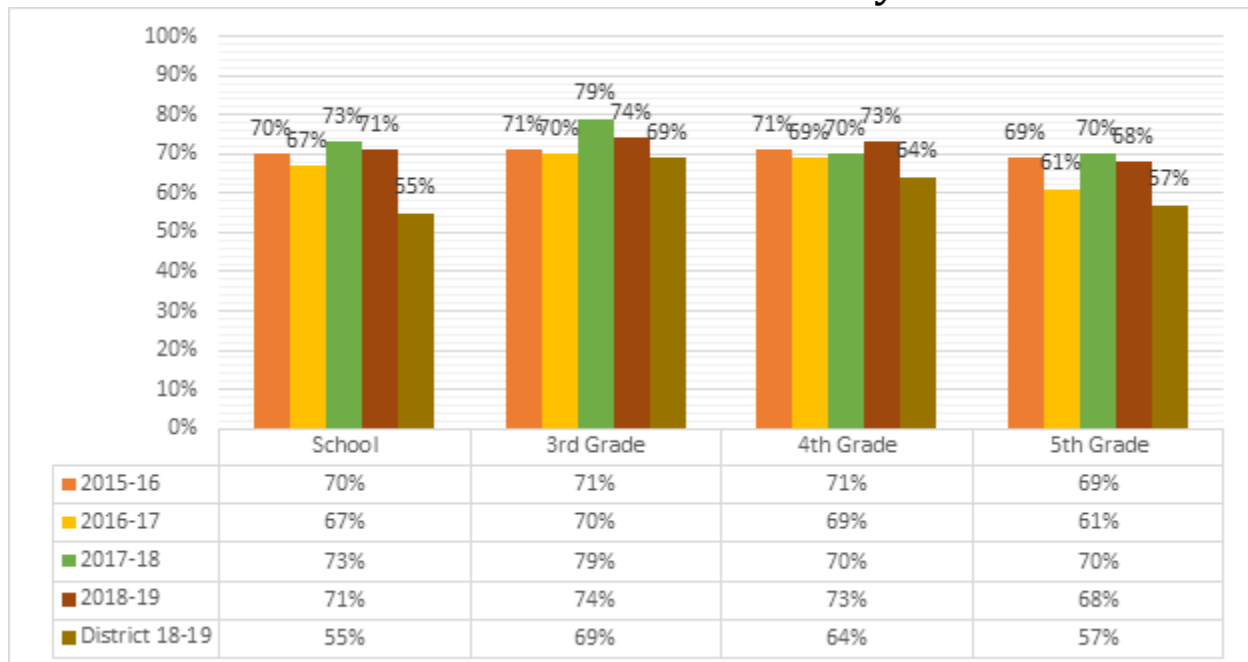
## Fourth Grade: SC Ready Math

Woodland students experienced tremendous growth in ELA on SCReady during the 2018-2019 school year. Students in grades third through fifth grew six points in ELA on SCReady. Woodland Elementary received an overall rating of "Excellent" on the South Carolina report card and received a Palmetto Gold award for the 2018-2019 school year for student achievement. We are also a finalist for the very prestigious SC Palmetto's Finest Award. We are proud of the hard work and dedication of our students, staff, and parents. We believe that our academic achievement is correlated to our students taking ownership of their learning by setting WIGS (Wildly Important Goals) in reading and math to track their progress and celebrate their success.

We continue to utilize our one-to-one technology in second through fifth grades to provide our students with a variety of educational experiences that support student-centered learning. Our teachers continue to dissect data available through MasteryConnect, TE21, and formative and summative assessments to meet the individual needs of our students. We continue to look at the needs of the "whole child." Through the support of our parents, PTA, community partners, and student leaders we are able to provide students with additional support through our Children's Clothing Closet, Backpack Meals, mentors, school supplies, small group counseling, and individual tutoring.

We continue to focus on strengthening and expanding our parent and community outreach and involvement through hosting the following events: Goodies for Grandparents, Muffins for Moms, Donuts for Dads, Leadership Day, Literacy Night, All Arts Event, Parent Leadership Nights, etc. As a member of the Greer Chamber of Commerce, Woodland Elementary continues to look for opportunities to give back to other schools and our community. This year, our student leaders collected food for the local food bank, donated clothing items to other schools in need, provided stockings to

children in the hospital, collected warm items for patients, collected soda tabs for the Ronald McDonald House, and provided supplies to local animal shelters. We continue to be amazed at the generosity of our children and families.

As the 2019-2020 school year comes to a close, I am so thankful for the support that I continue to receive as principal of Woodland Elementary School from the students, faculty & staff, parents, and community members. I am honored to serve as the principal of Woodland Elementary, and I am excited about our school's future.
