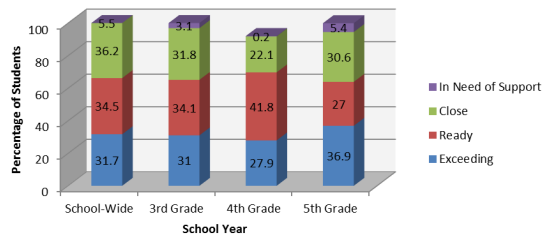

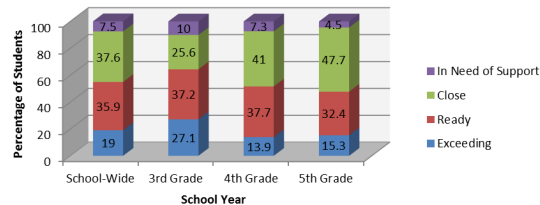

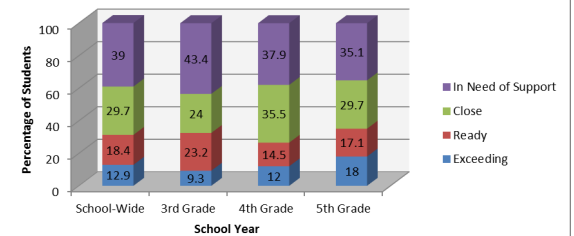
**Performance Levels for ACT Aspire English

Spring 2015**



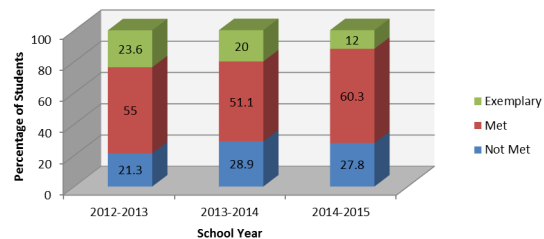
**Performance Levels for ACT Aspire Reading
