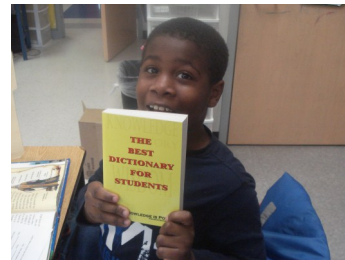

As mandated in Chapter 18, Title 59 of the 1976 Code, the Education Accountability Act was amended ([May 2008](#)) to provide for the development of a new statewide assessment program. The PASS is administered to South Carolina public school students, including charter school students in grades three through eight.
