Blue Ridge Middle School overlooks the mountains offering a peaceful environment. It is a sixth, seventh and eighth grade school located in the northwestern corner of South Carolina and is a part of Greenville County Schools. The school has the largest geographical attendance area and currently serves 935 students.

Blue Ridge Middle is in its 27th year. There are several staff members that were a vital part of the school's induction year and are still making an impact in the community today. The current site is the location of the original Blue Ridge High School, which was built in 1954. The building was completely renovated in 2001.

Blue Ridge Middle School provides opportunities for students to take courses that offer high school credit (Carnegie Units). Courses available include Honors Algebra I, English I Honors, and Desktop Publishing. The Gifted and Talented program is taught through language arts. Advanced math is offered as well. Blue Ridge also offers a variety of extracurricular activities. Teams include baseball, softball, soccer and basketball, and volleyball.

Drama is also offered after school, and students are given the opportunity to audition for and participate in a school-wide theatrical performance.


