Test Data – In order to achieve Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) as defined by *No Child Left Behind Act*, in 2011, our school was required to have 79% and 79.4% of tested students score in the MET or EXEMPLARY levels on the PASS Test in both math and reading respectively. While overall scores met these standards, two subgroups did not therefore it was determined that the school did not meet AYP.

Every Minute Counts

Thomas E. Kerns Elementary understands the importance of parent involvement in every child's education. In 2008, the SIC started Every Minute Counts, an initiative to increase time spent with parents and children in engaging activities. Thomas E. Kerns Elementary is a Title I school which receives supplemental federal funding. These funds are used to reduce class size, provide specialized staff, and professional development for teachers. Additionally, the funds are used to provide extended day tutoring to students in grades 2–5.

The enrollment of Thomas E. Kerns Elementary School is approximately 600 students. The population of students is diverse representing five different ethnic groups. The population of Thomas E. Kerns Elementary is significantly transient and **91.4%** of the student body qualify for free or reduced priced meals.

Measuring Academic Progress (MAP), a district-wide testing initiative, is used to track student growth. Data indicate students are moving forward in their knowledge and concepts of basic skills in math and reading.

Response to Intervention (RtI) is a program designed to identify the needs of students in their beginning literacy skills. Results from the **fall 2011** screening of the kindergarteners indicated **58%** of students at Thomas E. Kerns Elementary began kindergarten with a Letter Sound Fluency score of **<2 letter sounds**. The kindergarten goal for students is a Letter Sound Fluency score of **31** letter sounds. In 2011, the RtI program was expanded to include first through third grade students.

Parents participate in bi-monthly trainings covering topics of interest. Frequently, these trainings are provided in both English and Spanish. Many parents are seeking further education to meet the ever changing advances of technology and parenting skills.

In 2007, our school implemented Positive Based Intervention Supports (PBIS). This intervention system rewards positive student behavior through individual and class rewards. Since the implementation of PBIS, data indicates a decline in office referrals resulting in more time on task for teachers. Our school is recognized by the State as an "Exemplar" school. This is the highest level of recognition! **MISSION** – The mission of Thomas E. Kerns Elementary School is to develop successful, responsible life-long learners.
