Mission Statement

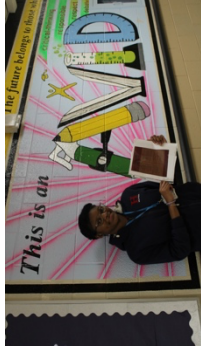

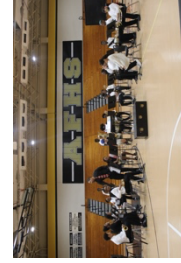
Vision Statement
