

## **School Achievements**

In 2019, 12% of tested students scored Proficient in English Language Arts (ELA) and 17% achieved at similar levels in Math, as measured by the South Carolina Alternate Assessment. (SC-ALT)  
(Achievement Testing received a Federal Waiver for the 2019-20 School Year)

In 2020, 87.52% of students mastered 100% or more of their IEP goals.

The Unique Learning System & Attainment curriculum are aligned with state standards and implemented school-wide. Additionally, the OnCourse System is in place for lesson planning, monitoring, and archiving.

Washington Center has a fully functioning SIC and PTA. This year the PTA has sponsored boxed lunches and breakfast for staff. Family Night consisted of local service provider information sent home to parents.
