School Achievements

In Spring 2021, students participated in the South Carolina Alternate Assessment. (SC-ALT). Students achieved average scores of 477 in the area of English Language Arts (ELA), 475 in Math, 542 in Science and 518 in US History.

In 2020-2021, 100% of students mastered 100% or more of their IEP goals.

The Unique Learning System & Attainment curriculum are aligned with state standards and implemented school-wide. Additionally, the OnCourse System is in place for lesson planning, monitoring, and archiving.
