SIC Annual Goals

Goal 1: Retention

To increase the retention of Level I students transitioning to Level II classes for the 2020 - 2021 school year by a minimum of 5% for any program below 70% retention; 10% for any program below 60% retention.

Progress: Met

This goal was met by every program area this year. The projected increase in total enrollment, due primarily to increased retention of students from Level I to Level II, is just over 26% per preliminary registration data.

Goal 2: Certifications

To increase the number of State recognized certifications earned by Donaldson Career Center students by 10%.

Progress: TBD

Current data (06/15/2020) indicate that Donaldson students have earned 166 state recognized certifications to date. Human Services students in **Esthetics** Cosmetology, Nail and Technology are waiting for LLR practical exams to resume so they can take their State licensing exams. In addition, other students are in the process of completing OSHA10 certifications online.

Student Achievement

CTE Completers

During the 2019 – 2020 School Year, 125 students earned Career and Technical Education Completer status. This is a 34% increase from the previous year.

State Recognized Certifications

At the time of this report, Donaldson Career Center students have earned a total of 166 state recognized credentials/certifications. As mentioned elsewhere in this report, industry testing for the Human Services program areas (Barbering, Cosmetology, Esthetics and Nail Technology) has been delayed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

State recognized certifications earned by Donaldson Career Center students as of 06/14/2020 include: Adobe ACA, ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) Brakes and Maintenance/Light Repair, AWS (American Welding Society), Microburst Learning Employability Skills, OSHA10, SC Firefighter I & II, SC Hair Braiding, ServSafe Food Handler & ServSafe Food Manager.

Certifications pending re-opening of LLR practical exam testing: Cosmetologist, Esthetician and Nail Technician.
