

2021-22 Report to the Community

Enoree Career Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four-million-dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. A new addition was completed in April of 2018 and houses classroom and lab space for the Machine Tool, Welding Technology, and Culinary Arts Programs. Additional renovations to create a new Mechatronics lab, expand the Automotive Technology shop, and improve the Building Construction lab took place during the summer of 2020.

Enoree Career Center serves students from four feeder high schools: Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton. Students from other high schools may elect to attend the center for specialized career center courses not offered at neighboring centers.

The programs and courses offered at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Firefighting, Law Enforcement, Graphic Communications, Machine Tool Technology, Mechatronics, and Welding Technology. Additionally, Enoree Career Center offers a Career Academy program for ninth grade students who want to learn more about career options and learning opportunities at the career centers.

Other highlights and achievements of our programs this year include:

- The total enrollment continues to grow, with over 300 new students projected to be enrolled in 2022-2023 and 160 students returning to complete their program, for a total of over 460 students.
- Enoree's Career Academy serves over 100 ninth-grade students from our feeder high schools, and has created a feeder pattern into our two-year programs of over 25%.
- Enoree and Greenville Technical College are working together to offer dual credit in Mechatronics and Culinary Arts for the 2022-23 school year.
- Machine Tool again earned a Gene Haas Foundation grant for student scholarships and teacher training.
- Enoree students were able to earn over 700 industry certifications.
- Graphic Communications student Kiley Meredith was named as Enoree's Student of the Year and will be recognized at the Salute to Education Banquet in late May.
- Culinary Arts student Jemyah Jones was named the Enoree Technology Champion and will be recognized at the Completer Celebration on May 26.
- 109 students are program Completers, and the seniors will be recognized at their high school graduation ceremony, as well as a Completer Celebration at the Greenville Drive game on May 26.
- Donnie Pearson, Auto Collision Instructor, is the 2022-23 Enoree Teacher of the Year.
- In January 2022, Mrs. Brana Myers, Director, and Ms. Tracy Cooper, Assistant Director, announced their retirement effective June 2022.
- Mr. Greg Cooke was named Director of Enoree Career Center for 2022-23.
- Mr. Adam Massey was named Assistant Director of Enoree Career Center for 2022-23.

Our school-wide motto of "Let's Get to Work!" remains the focus as we to provide instruction and work-based experiences that provide students with advantages in their next steps, including entering the workforce, the military, and continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
