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## 2016 – 2017 Summary to the Community

Enoree Career Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four million dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. The school is currently undergoing another building project that will be completed in the fall of 2017. The new addition will house classroom and lab space for the Machine Tool, Welding Technology, and Culinary Arts Programs.

Enoree Career Center serves students from four feeder high schools: Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton. Students from other high schools may elect to attend the center for specialized career center courses not offered at neighboring centers.

The programs and courses offered at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Service Technology, Building Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Firefighting, Law Enforcement, Graphic Arts, Fashion Merchandising, Animation, Digital Multimedia, and Welding Technology. Additionally, Enoree Career Center works with the Special Education Department of Greenville County Schools to provide a Career Rotation and Development Program for Occupational Diploma students.

Other highlights and achievements of our programs include:

- Enoree maintains dual credit and articulation agreements with Greenville Technical College, Virginia College, and Tri-County Technical College.
- Students are able to earn industry certifications as part of the district's Graduation Plus Initiative.
- Twenty-two Enoree students participated in internships and co-ops with local industry and business. Several placements will lead to summer and full-time work.
- Enoree Career Center gained 100% Participation Status with the SkillsUSA organization.
- Twenty Enoree students competed in the State SkillsUSA competition.
- Five Enoree students were medalists in the State SkillsUSA competition, with two earning Gold Medals the right to compete at the SkillsUSA National Leadership Conference in Louisville, Kentucky.
- Enoree students participated in various service projects including a canned food drive, assistance at local elementary schools, and fund raisers for the Leukemia/Lymphoma Society and the Alzheimer's Association.
- Seventeen Enoree seniors were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society and were awarded regalia to be worn during graduation.
- Enoree named an Outstanding Student of the Year and a Greenville Tech Scholar Award for each program, each to be recognized at the school's Awards Day on May 16, 2017.
- One Enoree senior was named as a Michelin Scholar and will work in an apprenticeship capacity for the company following graduation.
- Over one-hundred "completers" will be celebrated at the Greenville County Schools Career and Technical Completers Ceremony at the Bon Secours Wellness Center on May 26, 2017.

The school's theme for the 2016-17 school year was "Don't forget to be AWESOME!" The letters of AWESOME served as reminders of attributes that prosperous workers and citizens should possess: Active, Working, Efficient, Safe, Optimistic, Motivated, Everyday! Our goal is to provide instruction and work-based experiences that provide students with advantages in their next steps, including entering the work-force, the military, and continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
