



Enoree Career and Technology Center GREENVILLE COUNTY SCHOOLS

2015-2016 SIC Report to the Community

Enoree Career and Technology Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four million dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year.

Enoree Career and Technology Center serves students primarily from Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton High School; however, students from any Greenville County high school may elect to attend the center for specialized career courses.

The programs/ courses taught at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Law Enforcement, Graphic Arts, Fashion Merchandising, Career Development/ Rotation, Firefighting, Welding, and Digital Multimedia. Two new programs were added for the 2015-2016 year. The Firefighting program allows students to receive Firefighter One and Two certification for the SC Fire Academy. The Welding program, which is based at Travelers Rest and Berea High Schools will allow students to receive American Welders Society national certification upon completion of the program.

Many of the courses taught at Enoree are dual-credit or have an articulation agreement in place with Greenville Tech.

- All programs are offered in accordance with the standards established by the SC State Department of Education Office of Career and Technology Education.
- Eighty percent of the programs at Enoree have an opportunity for the students to receive national certification
- Enoree had 27 students compete in the State Skills USA Competition
- Enoree had two Skills USA State Champions and six students place second or third in the state in individual or team Skills USA competition and sixteen other students placed in the top ten in the state.

Students are currently taking certification exams for the 15-16 year.

- In the 2014-2015 year Enoree Cosmetology students had an 88% success rate on the State Cosmetology Certification Exam.
- In the 2014-2015 year Enoree Our Auto Collision Repair students had an 85% success rate on the ASE Auto Collision Certification Exam.

Enoree selects students of the month in each program at the school. Students of the year in each program were recognized at the Center's awards day, as well as director's awards winners, citizenship awards winners and scholarship recipients. Outstanding students are awarded membership in the National Technical Honor Society.

Our goal is to prepare our students for the next step, whether it is entering the work force or continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
