Student Achievement

For the 2021-2022 school year, Wren High School continued to rank among the highest in the state on mandated testing such as End of Course Testing, AP, and SAT/ACT. Our 2021 SAT and ACT scores were higher than both the district and state averages. In addition, our school's AP exam passage rates were higher than both the state and national averages with three of our programs, AP Literature, AP Research, and AP Seminar, securing a 100% passage rate.

Our school's EOC passage rates improved from last year, especially in the areas of English 2 (94.3% compared to 93% in 2021) and US History (72.4% compared to 65.8% in 2021).

Lastly, Wren High School's graduation rate also improved from 93.2% in 2021 to 95.6% in 2022. Wren High School was once again recognized by US News & World Report as one of the top high schools in the Nation.
