Student Achievement

For the 2018-19 school year, Wren High School received a rating of EXCELLENT on the annual South Carolina School Report Card, acknowledging that our school's performance "substantially exceeds the criteria to ensure all students meet the Profile of the SC Graduate."

Wren High School's graduation rate improved to 94.9%. The five percent of students that did not obtain a high school diploma includes students that were enrolled in an occupational diploma program. Many of those students still achieved the goal of being career ready upon completion of their instructional program at Wren High School. As always, we are very proud of our efforts to get EVERY student prepared for life after high school with a diploma.

Wren High School was once again recognized by US News & World Report as one of the top high schools in the Nation. This is the first such recognition for Wren High School since 2016.

Wren High School continues to rank among the highest in the state on mandated testing such as End of Course Testing, AP, and SAT/ACT.
