Grade 4 MAP results exceeded the national and district averages in math and met the national and district average in reading.

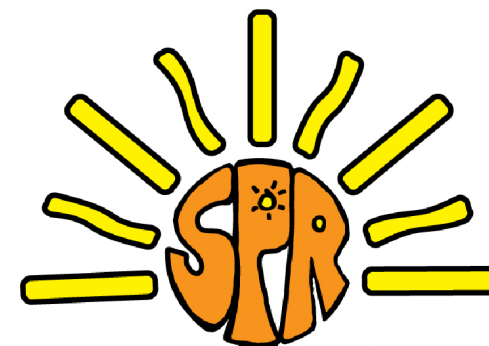
Grade 5 MAP results met the national and district averages in both reading and math.
