Our students participate in the state Science Fair. Several 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students received recognition for their projects at the state level.

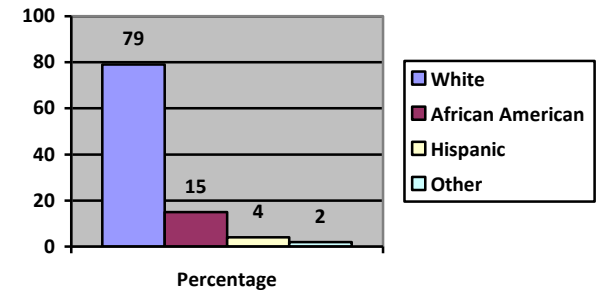
The school participated in CogAt and Iowa testing to identify students who are gifted and talented. Several students have met the requirements and will receive services.
