Our 4th & 5th grade students scored above the state average in ELA, math, and science on the end of the year statewide assessments, SC Ready and SC Pass.

NSES scored higher than the 14 other districts in our area on the 4th grade math, 5th grade ELA, and 5th grade math SC Ready Tests for the 2021-2022 school year.

Satisfaction with home-school relations increased from 75% to 93.3% as indicated by the school report card.

## Goals For 2023-2024

- Student Achievement  
Increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring meets or exceeds by 3% on SC Ready in ELA and math
- Incorporate inquiry-based units and lessons within the curriculum in order to engage students in active learning and real-world problem-solving
- Implement targeted, small group reading instruction to increase student achievement in reading
- Teacher/Administrator Quality  
Increase the number of teachers satisfied with home-school relations by 2% as indicated on the school's report card
- School Climate  
Increase the percentage of parents satisfied with home-school relations by 2% as indicated by the school's report card
- Provide opportunities for students to lead in-class conferences with parents regarding their achievements and grades
