Community Involvement

- The HES Junior Beta Club, Girls Club and the Boys Club prepared baskets for senior citizens at the Hampton County Council on Aging.

Professional Development

- HES teachers continue to implement **High Progress Literacy** processes to engage all students in reading, writing, researching in appropriately challenging text at least 75% of the time in order to learn content. These close reading processes help students to build deep understandings of science and social studies materials.
 - *Through the **Read to Succeed Act (R2S)*** HES has a reading coach to support all teachers across all content areas. The goal is to help all teachers increase the literacy levels of all students through effective instructional and intervention strategies.
- ### Growth Mindset
- One of our goals is to increase student achievement. The three elements used to achieve this are multiple career paths, professional growth and instructionally focused accountability. We have a Leadership Team that consists of an instructional coach, three mentor teachers, and two administrators. We have embedded weekly professional development (PLC meetings) during planning periods and weekly collaborative team meetings to make intentional decisions for continuous school improvement and professional growth.
