Community Involvement

- In an effort to increase math numeracy, Academic Intensity in Math (AIM) was implemented in all 4th grade classes.

One of our goals is to increase student achievement. The three elements used to achieve this are multiple career paths, professional growth and instructionally focused accountability. We have a Leadership Team that consists of a master teacher, five mentor teachers, and two administrators. We have embedded weekly professional development (Cluster meetings) during planning periods and weekly afterschool leadership team meetings and vertical team meetings to make intentional decisions for continuous school improvement and professional growth.
