Goals to Be Accomplished by 2016

- 90% of high school students will earn state high school diplomas within four years or less (on time) after entering the ninth grade by 2016.
- 95% of second-year high school students will pass HSAP ELA by 2016.
- 95% of second-year high school students will pass HSAP Math by 2016.
- 90% of the students will pass the State's English I end-of-course test by 2016.
- 95% of Algebra I and Math Tech II students will pass the State's end-of course Algebra I test by 2016.
- 80% of the students will pass the State's U.S. History end-of-course test by 2016.
- 90% of the students will pass the State's Biology I end-of-course test by 2016.
- The average SAT score (combined math and verbal) for high school students will be equal to or surpass the national average.
- The average ACT score (combined) for high school seniors will be equal to or surpass the national average.

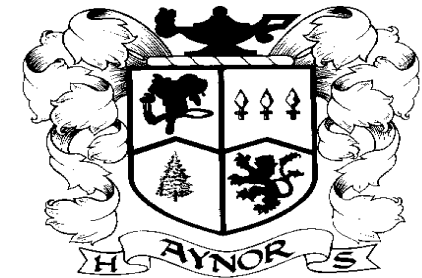
