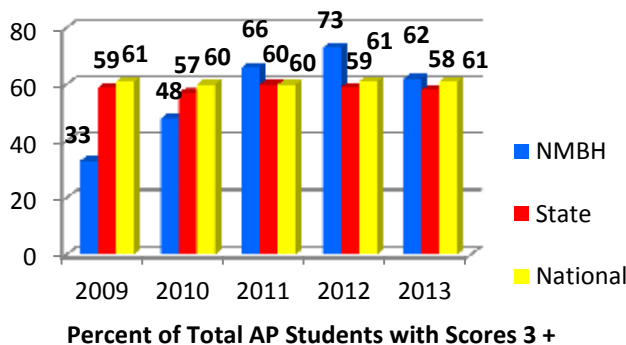
North Myrtle Beach High School's Mission Statement

School & Community

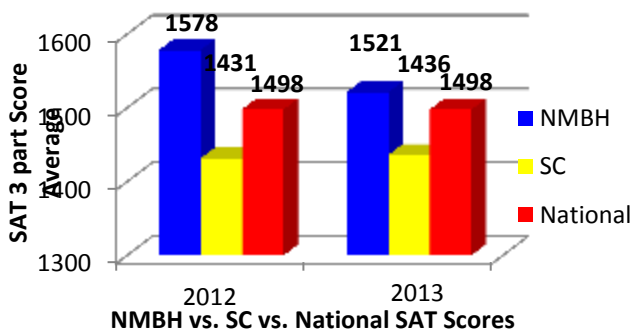
North Myrtle Beach High School is one of the nine base high schools in Horry County. NMBH is located in Horry County; a county known for its' tourist and hospitality industry. NMBH is located only a few miles from the beach, and is surrounded by an abundance of golf courses. The current school building was completed and opened in 1979. North Myrtle Beach High School is located in Little River, SC. It serves students from the Barefoot Landing, Windy Hill, Atlantic Beach, Crescent Beach, North Myrtle Beach, Cherry Grove, Little River, Longs, Wampee, Brooksville, Hand, and Red Bluff areas. The school's current enrollment hinders around 1250 students, and consists of students from 9th to 12th grade. The school is on a 4x4 block schedule (2 semesters-fall and spring). Students take four classes a semester every day for 90 minutes. The fall semester begins in August and continues to January. The spring semester begins in January and finishes the school year in June. NMBH is also supported by many post-secondary institutions committed to higher learning, such as Coastal Carolina University, Horry Georgetown Technical College, Miller-Motte Technical College, and ITT Technical College. It is a 3A (AAA) athletic school and participates in the South Carolina High School Athletic League. North Myrtle Beach is also privileged to be supported not only by the area newspaper, The Sun News, but also the local newspaper, The North Myrtle Beach Times.

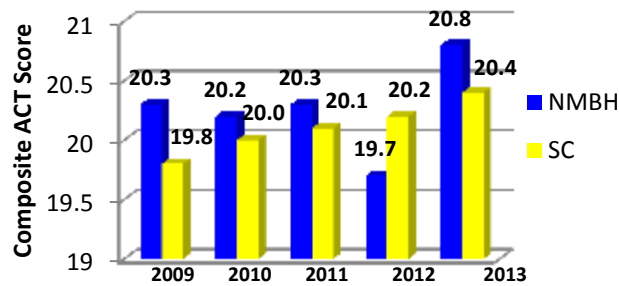
NMBH vs. SC vs. National SAT Scores

2013-2014 Accomplishments

- North Myrtle Beach High School received an Absolute Rating of Excellent, with a Growth Rating of Excellent (up from Excellent and Good in 2012) on the State School Report Card.
- NMBHS was ranked second out of 46 in the "Schools Like Us" section of the School Report Card.
- North Myrtle Beach High received The Palmetto Gold Award, for our school report card performance.
- US News & World Report named NMBHS a Bronze Winner for Best High Schools.
- Our pass rate on EOC's improved from 82.3% to 82.9%, with increases in Algebra 1 at 93% and English 1 with 86.2% (up from 86.1% and 79.9% respectively).
- AP scores for North Myrtle Beach High were above both the state and national averages.
- Our Teacher of the Year was Lesley Etherson, who advanced as a Top 5 Finalist for the District.
- Twelve Graduates were Palmetto Fellows Scholarship recipients.
- 195 students received scholarships, for a total dollar amount of \$9,310,274.
- 167 dual credit college courses were earned by our graduates.
- 75 graduates were eligible for the 4 year LIFE Scholarship.
- The NMBHS Mock Trial Team repeated as State Champions, finishing second in the national competition.
- In sports, 13 teams made the playoffs. The football team finished 9-3, made it to the 2nd round of the playoffs, and had the best record in school history. NMBHS teams were Region Champions in Girls' Swimming, Volleyball, Softball, Track & Field, and Boys' Golf. The Volleyball Team was also Lower State Champions.

In order to graduate from high school, a student must successfully complete 24 units of credit. The state of South Carolina requires all students to complete certain courses.

Students who otherwise meet the requirements for a state high school diploma must demonstrate proficiency in keyboarding and computer literacy as a condition for the receipt of a high school diploma.

At least one time during the four years of grades 9-12, each student will receive a program of instruction in comprehensive health to include the specified curriculum and minutes of instruction as outlined in the Comprehensive Health Education Act of 1988 (CHE).

Exit Examination (HSAP)

All 10th grade students are required to take the HSAP. Passage of the exit examination is a condition for the receipt of a state high school diploma. This requirement also applies to students in an adult education program who are seeking a diploma.
