Academic Opportunities

To ensure that all students are college and career-ready, Conway High School offers a wide array of course options on the college preparatory, world language, honors, and advanced placement levels. We do this while providing students with a comprehensive high school experience that includes opportunities in the fine arts, athletics and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). Conway High School is also proud to offer students a rigorous, nationally recognized STEM program where students can use 21st-century skills to solve hands-on, real-world problems. Students enrolled in our Project Lead The Way Engineering, Computer Science and Biomedical Science programs earn honors credit and can potentially earn dual enrollment credit. Students who enroll in Pharmacology Technology, Veterinary Science, and Medical Billing and Coding can have the opportunity to earn a national certification that can launch them into a career immediately after graduating from high school.

 same event. HOSA was invited to participate in the HOSA virtual
 International Leadership Conference in June 2020.
- The theater program won best costume design twice, earned outstanding actor awards, and earned three excellent ratings in the All-County competition over the past three years
