Academic Opportunities

To ensure that all students are college and career-ready, Conway High School offers a wide array of course options on the college preparatory, world language, honors, and advanced placement levels. We do this while providing students with a comprehensive high school experience that includes opportunities in the fine arts, athletics and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). Students also have the opportunity to participate in the Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID) program to prepare for their future through methods of writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading. Conway High is also proud to be a Cognia-certified STEM school that offers students the ability to use 21st-century skills to solve hands-on, real-world problems. Students focus on STEM learning in all content areas. In addition, students enrolled in our Project Lead the Way Engineering, Computer Science, and Biomedical Science programs earn honors credit and can potentially earn dual-enrollment credit. Students who enroll in Pharmacology Technology, Veterinary Science, and Hospitality and Tourism can earn a national certification that can launch them into a career immediately after graduating from high school.
