The mission of Loris High School is to prepare all students to achieve excellence by creating an environment conducive to learning where students, staff, and families work together to promote the skills needed in a continuously changing world.

SIC Annual Goals

LHS has established goals for Student Learning as outlined in our Strategic Plan. Four of these goals are:

- 1. The pass rate on the English I EOC Exam will increase to 80% for students taught in our building, and the achievement gap will be narrowed by 25%.
- 2. The pass rate on the US History EOC Exam will increase to 82% for students taught in our building, and the achievement gap will be narrowed by 25%.
- 3. The pass rate on the Biology EOC Exam will increase to 75% for students taught in our building, and the achievement gap will be narrowed by 25%.
- 4. 70% of our disabled students will meet proficiency in ELA as measured by HSAP in 2011-2012.

End-of-Course Test Pass Rate

Students took state End-of-Course Tests in Algebra I, English I, Biology, Physical Science, and US History. These pass rates include all students who are assigned to LHS as their base high school. Our overall pass rate for 2010 was 65%. This improved to 66.1% in 2011. There were increases in Algebra I and Physical Science.

High School Assessment Program

Our pass rate for first-time HSAP takers improved from 73.6% in 2010 to 80.6% in 2011. Our overall passage rate in spring 2011 was 91.9%.

SAT and ACT

Our average SAT score is 942 for Critical Reading and Math. The average SAT composite score is 1376. This is an increase of 65 points from 2010.

Our average ACT score is 18. This score remains constant.

Additional Information

Loris High School is a community-oriented school focused on rigor, relationships, and relevance to meet the unique needs of each student.

We have a diverse student population. Of our 755 students, 52.8% are white, 40.5% are African American, 4.6% are Hispanic, and 2.1% are of other racial or ethnic backgrounds. 73.4% of our students receive either free or reduced lunch.

To meet some of the unique needs of our students, LHS offers a variety of programs. Extended Options is a free after-school tutoring program that is offered throughout the school year on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Bus transportation is also provided for this program.

SAT and ACT preparation workshops are provided in advance of each test date. These workshops are conducted by teachers who excel in their given subject area.

LHS implemented a Renaissance Program to recognize and reward student achievement and improvement. This program offers special incentives to motivate students to reach their potential academically. 300 students have participated each nine-week grading period.
