Academics

Myrtle Beach High School offers twenty-two Advanced Placement Courses including: AP Spanish, AP Capstone, the AP International Diploma, and an AP Academy. Myrtle Beach High School surpassed the SC and Global Average in the majority of AP courses. In addition to AP course offerings, MBHS also offers, Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Engineering and Computer Science Courses, Dual- Enrollment Opportunities through a partnership with Horry-Georgetown Technical College (HGTC), Teacher Cadet through a partnership with Coastal Carolina University (CCU), Work-Based Learning with Health Science internships, Seahawk New Tech Network, Accounting, General Management, Sports Medicine, Web and Digital Communications, NJROTC, Theater, Art, Music, College Prep and Honors Level Courses. Eighty-seven students were inducted into the National Honor Society, one hundred and fifty-seven new students were inducted into the National Beta Club, and twenty-six into Rho Kappa. We will be holding inductions for the Science National Honor Society and Mu Alpha Theta in the late Spring as well. Three students were selected to Palmetto Girls' State and we are awaiting the Palmetto Boys' State application process.

Fine and Performing Arts

Students in the Fine Arts program have been accepted into three art competitions this year. We have artwork displayed at Art Fields Jr in Lake City, Burroughs and Chapin Museum in Myrtle Beach, and Sea Coast Art Gallery in Market Commons. One of our Senior artists has been awarded a one-year membership into the American Society of Marine Artists for their talents.

Art 2 students have completed a shaded painting project and did a fantastic job and is on display. Art 1 students are learning how to mix colors in a complicated color wheel painting.

This year the Orchestra Program was able to have two virtual performances: One for the holidays and the other for St. Patrick's Day. They will have one live performance on 4/29 for A Night of Hope. 
