

Our school is helping all students develop world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate in various ways. Concrete Primary's theme for the 2018-2019 school year was "Camp Concrete - Where Learning Adventures Begin", which led the focus on critical thinking throughout instruction. Guided Reading and Guided Math instruction continue to drive the curriculum. Teachers continued to implement South Carolina College and Career Readiness Standards into their instruction along with a standards-based report card to provide world class knowledge for all students.

Creativity and the use of technology remained an important part of daily instruction at Concrete Primary. Creation apps were used on class iPads throughout the day to enhance and strengthen our instructional program. Students were able to instantly share much of their work with parents through a digital portfolio.

Students were also able to showcase their creativity and individual talents through our school's related art classes. A local potter joined our students in art class to create pottery pieces unique to each homeroom. Second graders collaborated with a local artist to create a painting that will be permanently displayed in the school. In music, each grade level held a

performance for family and friends to showcase their musical talents. Field Day provided a friendly atmosphere for competition as students demonstrated skills learned in P.E.

Outstanding character and behavior exhibited by students led to recognition each Friday on the morning announcements for being "Happy Campers." Monthly celebrations were coordinated by our guidance counselor for students that modeled the character education word of the month. Each nine weeks, homeroom classes were recognized and earned special rewards for outstanding behavior through our BE FANTASTIC program. Based on Ron Clark's The Essential 55, BE FANTASTIC provided students with school wide rules that helped them succeed both in and out of the classroom.

The partnership with our PTSO continued to be an integral part of Concrete Primary. PTSO fundraisers included Spirit Nights at local restaurants and Box Tops for Education competitions. These fundraisers helped provide classroom supplies as well as support events like Grits for Grands, Donuts for Dads, Muffins for Moms, Clay Night, and the Concrete Carnival.

Parental and community involvement remained key to the success of our students. In collaboration with the local YMCA, community members served as mentors for several students through the Y Mentor program. Our students also benefited from the successful WatchD.O.G.S. program. These "Dads of Great Students" volunteered time to help in classrooms and serve as positive role models. Teachers and students hosted family members to various special events throughout the year including a living Wax Museum, a Poetry Cafe, and a school wide Literacy Night.
