The SIC annual goal updates are as follows:

Red Folders- Red folders are distributed at MBMS at the end of the first 3 grading periods. These folders include important information for parents, including their child's goals for the year, report cards, test scores and explanations, as well as the popular "kitchen table conference" form, which outlines topics for students to discuss with their parents. Students bring these forms back, signed by a parent, for a reward. These folders prove a valuable tool in keeping parents informed about their child's school lives.

Incentive Programs- The largest incentive program at MBMS is sponsored by the PTO. Students earn Hawk cards from teachers and can use those cards in the Hawksnest to buy various items such as school supplies, t-shirts or candy. MBMS also has a new game room, complete with board games and foosball. This popular reward has been used to

encourage students to do their best both in and out of the classroom.

<u>PTO-</u> The PTO at MBMS was led by Sunnie McGonigal this year and the group provided tremendous support to the school. One member donated a large rock, and the "Spirit rock" is a fun way to share any kind of positive message. Parents or teachers can rent the rock and paint it to celebrate birthdays, accomplishments, or any inspiring messages. The PTO has generously donated proceeds from the rock to Juli's Closet this year.

COVID19- This school year is closing on unusual terms. In response to COVID19, South Carolina closed all public schools beginning March 16, 2020. The administration, staff and teachers at Myrtle Beach Middle School have done a remarkable job shifting to an online learning platform for all students, while continually checking on their health and well being as this national health crisis unfolds. The School Improvement Council looks forward to renewed public health and prosperity for the 2020/2021 school year.

#### Juli's Closet

After Hurricane Florence hit the area last year, a woman named Juli sent Dr. Christy a check and simply said to do something to "help the kids". We had a lot of students who suffered quite a bit during the storm and we also have a large population of students who live in poverty. Dr. Christy had the idea to start a closet and she brought the idea to the School Improvement Committee to see if we could make it happen. We did. The SIC installed shelves, shopped, organized and opened the

closet. This year the SIC has continued its work with the closet, trying to find easy ways for guidance counselors to communicate needs and get items to students while protecting their privacy. We have secured several donations from our community this year, from parents, teachers, community members, churches, and even our own PTO. During the mandated school closure due to Covid19, Juli's closet provided groceries, hand sanitizer, and basic essentials to families upon request.

#### **South Carolina School Report Card Updates**

The South Carolina Department of Education rates schools in two major areas: academics and environment. Rating options are excellent, good, average and below average.

In the category of Academic Achievement, Myrtle Beach Middle School earned 53 points and a rating of Good. The excellent rating required 56 total points. Myrtle Beach Middle School is working diligently toward the highest possible academic rating.

In the category of School Environment, Myrtle Beach Middle School earned 8 of 10 points and a rating of Good. With 62% of our students indicating a high level of engagement with school, our goal is to increase that number each year.
