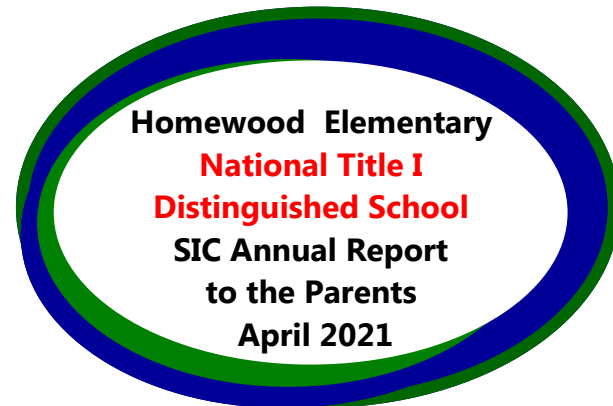
HWE has a Safety & Crisis Management Plan and conducts various drills.
