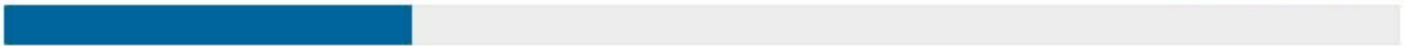

English Language Arts (Reading and Writing) - Percent Met or Exceeding

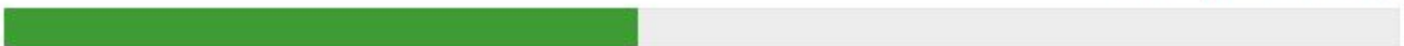

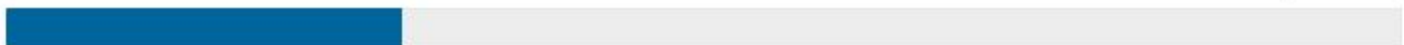

Mathematics - Percent Met or Exceeding

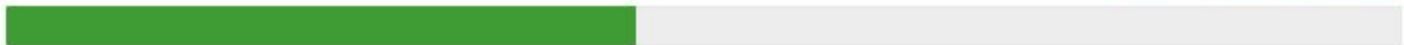

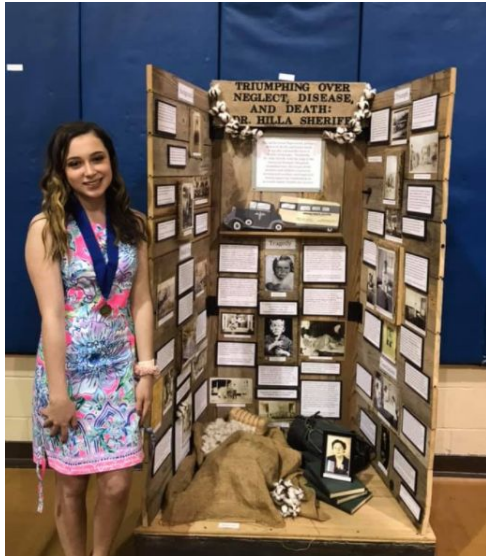

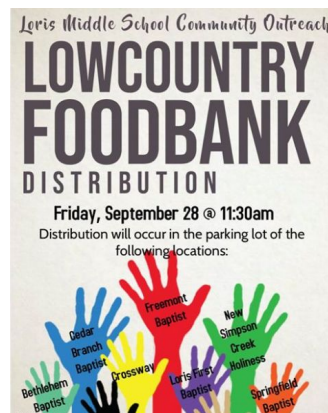
Title I Funds supported the following initiatives for the 2018-2019 school year:
