

Additional Information

Waccamaw Elementary School is located just outside of Conway, South Carolina and is a part of the Carolina Forest attendance area. The school serves approximately 909 students in grades Pre-K through fifth grade in the 2019-20 school year. Currently, approximately 51% of WES students are Caucasian, 24% Black or African American, 16% Hispanic/Latino, 1% American Indian or Alaska Native, and 8% two or more races. The 2019-20 poverty index for WES is 76%. Currently Waccamaw Elementary School has 65 Professional staff members who work diligently to ensure growth for all students at WES.

WES PTO sponsors numerous events for students and families such as: Pastries for Parents, Fall Festival, Fifth Grade lunches for their 5th grade field trip, and help with our Lifeskill Breakfast every month, etc. They also provide staff appreciation opportunities and support throughout the year.

We have numerous partnerships with a variety of local businesses that support our school. These range from Walmart to The Disney Store.

Local churches and other organizations have provided monetary support, school supplies, clothing and shoes, and gift cards for families in need.
