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## Achievements in 2015-2016

Moving FORWARD in the Classroom, on the Field, and in the Community

#### This list includes just a small sample of the many accomplishments we have enjoyed at SJHS over the past year -

- St. James High School was recognized as Palmetto's Finest by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators!
- South Carolina recognized our school with the *Palmetto Gold Award* for general performance. This was the fifth consecutive year that our school has been recognized with this award!
- The four-year graduation rate for the St. James Class of 2015 was 83.2%. This is the second highest on-time graduation rate in the school's history.
- The graduating class of 2015 was offered over \$8.3 million in scholarships. More than 60% of these graduates were eligible for the South Carolina LIFE Scholarship.
- Overall student pass rates on Advanced Placements exams continued to outpace other schools. Advanced Placement students at St. James High School earned a mean AP exam score of 3.26, higher than county, state, national, and global averages!
- Our students' average score on the SAT remained higher than district and state averages. Composite ACT scores for collegebound seniors also met the national average. The school is currently developing plans to launch an Advanced Placement Institute in 2016-2017, which will dramatically increase course offerings and draw more students to these rigorous classes.
- Students earned an overall pass rate of 90.2% on state-mandated End of Course assessments in 2014-2015. This is over 11% higher than the average for schools with similar student populations.
- Our 2014 St. James High School Teacher of the Year, Mr. Paul Hudacko, was named as a top-five finalist for the Horry County Schools Teacher of the Year. Since 2007, St. James has had four teachers named as top-five finalists, more than any other school in the Horry County!
- The SJHS School Improvement Council was named a finalist for the Dick and Tunky Riley Award as one of the SICs in the state of South Carolina.
- In addition to producing the monthly *Shark Attack* magazine, journalism students also produced a number of special editions, including *Forward* and *Portraits*. Students in the Media department also produced a daily television show, maintained an online presence through *Shark Attack Online*, and managed a short-range radio station, *WSJH*.
- Students from the Fine Arts, English, and Media departments collaborated to hold the school's first annual *Creative Arts Night*, showcasing drama, music, literature, and film.
- The Future Business Leaders of America, Virtual Enterprise, and DECA programs continue to excel at the local, state, and national levels. The school's chapter of FCCLA also won Gold for its Ampu-Teddies project at the state convention.
- AP English Language student Meghan Smith was awarded first place in the annual South Strand Optimist club essay contest.
- The St. James High School Academic Team once again qualified for the NAQT National Academic Team Championship Tournament by winning the 2015 Horry County Schools Academic Olympics. This is the team's 3rd title in five years.
- The Pride of St. James High School Marching band once again qualified to participate in the state championship tournament. During the season, the band received numerous superior ratings and top rankings in a number of categories.
- The St. James High School Drama Department competed in both the Horry County and South Carolina Theatre Festivals. Zach Olds was named an All-Star Cast Member at the annual SC Theatre Festival. The spring musical production of *Legally Blonde* received stellar reviews and was seen by over 1,600 people during it's four day run.
- The school's Choral department started three new ensemble groups, including the Forward Motion show choir. Choral director, Mr. Kenneth Bedwell, was named a quarterfinalist for the Grammy Music Educator of the Year.
- The Saint James Army Junior ROTC unit continued to amass numerous awards and distinctions, including winning its 4th title of *Grand Champion* at the regional drill competition. Colonel Steve Cellucci was recognized as Senior Army Instructor of the Year.
- St. James Visual Arts students continue to excel in local and regional art shows and competitions, including the title of Best in Show at the 14th annual Horry County Schools Juried Art Show.
- Four St. James athletic coaches were named Region Coach of the Year. Two coaches were also recognized as Toast of the Coast Coach of the Year by *The Sun News*.
- The girls' golf team capped off an amazing season by winning the state tournament. Smith Knaffle was named to the All-State and Toast of the Coast teams. Coach Denise Noll was recognized as region Coach of the Year.
- The St. James Sharks varsity softball team had the 9th highest team GPA in the nation. 11 of 13 players earned Academic All-American status.
- The varsity cheerleading squad earned the title of Lower State Champions and finished 5th overall at the state competition.
- Student trainer Brooklyn Linton was the first SJHS student to earn a spot at the annual North/South All-Star football game.
- To date, five Shark student-athletes have signed national letters of intent to continue their playing career at the next level.

#### Measuring our Achievements

While there is no definitive way to identify a high-performing high school, accountability guidelines developed by the state of South Carolina and the federal government do give us a useful way to measure our achievements. At Saint James we have adopted the following performance goals to help us reach our school's full potential.
