## Achievements in 2014-2015



Moving FORWARD in the Classroom, on the Field, and in the Community

#### Listed below is just a small sample of the many accomplishments we have enjoyed at SJHS over the past year -

- St. James High School was named a finalist for the 2015 *Palmetto's Finest Award*, one of just three high schools in the state to earn this distinction!
- Saint James ranked *Excellent* in Absolute rating and *Good* in the Growth rating on the 2014 South Carolina School Report Card. This is the fourth year in a row that our school has received an *Excellent* overall rating! Of the 33 high schools in the state with student populations similar to ours, Saint James ranked 4th in overall performance.
- South Carolina recognized our school with the *Palmetto Gold Award* for general performance. This was the fourth consecutive year that our school has been recognized with this award!
- The four-year graduation rate for the St. James Class of 2014 was 81.8%.
- The graduating class of 2014 was been offered over \$8.1 million in scholarships.
- Through the 135th day of school, our 2014-2015 daily student attendance rate is 95.7%.
- Overall student pass rates on Advanced Placements exams continued to outpace other schools. Advanced Placement students at St. James High School earned a mean AP exam score of 3.14, higher than county, state, national, and global averages!
- Our students' average score on the SAT remained higher than district and state averages. Composite ACT scores for college-bound seniors also met the national average.
- Students earned an overall pass rate of 89.2% on state-mandated End of Course assessments in 2013-2014. This is over 10% higher than the average for schools with similar student populations. Student pass rates on the Algebra 1 and Biology End of Course assessments were the highest in Horry County.
- Our own St. James High School Teacher of the Year, Mr. Paul Hudacko, was named as a top-five finalist for the Horry County Schools Teacher of the Year. Since 2007, St. James has had four teachers named as top-five finalists, more than any other school in the district!
- St. James teachers Ms. Kristen Rogers and Mrs. Jeanna Johnson presented at the 2014 *High Schools that Work* National Summer Staff Development Conference in July. Instructional Coach Brett Mahaffey presented at the SC School Board Association Conference in February.
- The *Learners at Work* program opened the *Fintastic Stitches Embroidery Program*, providing students on a non-traditional diploma track valuable experience in the operating a business.
- The Future Business Leaders of America, Virtual Enterprise, and DECA programs continue to excel at the local, state, and national levels. Student Body President Alyssa Koziarski was to served as President of the South Carolina FBLA.
- The St. James High School Academic Team once again qualified for the NAQT National Academic Team Championship Tournament by winning the 2014 Horry County Schools Academic Olympics.
- The Pride of St. James High School Marching band once again qualified to participate in the state championship tournament. During the season, the band received numerous superior ratings and top rankings in a number of categories.
- The St. James High School Drama Department competed in both the Horry County and South Carolina Theatre Festivals. Senior Danielle Jeanjaquet won the Palmetto Theatre Association's Senior Theatre Scholarship. The spring musical production of *Footloose* received stellar reviews and was seen by over 1,600 people during it's four day run.
- The St. James High School choral department traveled to Walt Disney world to perform in the annual Candlelight Processional at EPCOT.
- The Saint James Army Junior ROTC unit continued to amass numerous awards and distinctions, including the title of *Grand Champions* at the regional drill competition. The cadets' academic competition squad also placed in the top 10 nationally!
- St. James Visual Arts students continue to excel in local and regional art shows and competitions. Senior Christina Melchiorre won *Best in Show* at the Horry Georgetown Juried Student Art Exhibition.
- Four St. James athletic coaches were named Region Coach of the Year.
- The girls' golf team capped off an amazing season by winning the SC Lower State Championship and finishing runner up at the state tournament. Two Lady Sharks golfers, Smith Knaffle and Kelli Smith were named to the All-State and Toast of the Coast teams.
- The St. James Sharks varsity softball team had the 12th highest team GPA in the nation. 11 of 13 players earned Academic All-American status.

### Measuring our Achievements

While there is no definitive way to identify a high-performing high school, accountability guidelines developed by the state of South Carolina and the federal government do give us a useful way to measure our achievements. At Saint James we have adopted the following performance goals to help us reach our school's full potential.
