Moving FORWARD in the Classroom, on the Field, and in the Community

- Listed below is just a small sample of the many accomplishments we have enjoyed at SJHS over the past year -
- Saint James High School ranked *Excellent* in both Absolute and Growth ratings on the 2013 South Carolina School Report Card. This is the second year in a row that our school has received *Excellent* rankings in both categories! Of the 31 high schools in the state with student populations similar to ours, Saint James ranked 4th in overall performance.
- South Carolina recognized our school with the *Palmetto Gold Award* for general performance. This was the third consecutive year that our school has been recognized with this award!
- The four-year graduation rate for the St. James Class of 2013 was 84.95%. This is the highest graduation rate in the school's history!
- As of May, the graduating class of 2014 has been offered over \$8.1 million in scholarships.
- Through the 135th day of school, our 2013-2014 daily student attendance rate is 96.7%. This is the highest rate in the school's history!
- Overall student pass rates on Advanced Placements exams continued to outpace state and national averages.
- Our students' average score on the SAT climbed dramatically to 1036. This represents a gain of nearly 50 points over last year's average score!
- Students earned an overall pass rate of 86.1% on state-mandated End of Course assessments in 2013. This is nearly 10% higher than the average for schools with similar student populations. Student pass rates on the US History and Constitution and Biology End of Course assessments were among the highest in Horry County.
- Our own St. James High School Teacher of the Year, Mrs. Beth Cox, was named as a top-five finalist for the Horry County Schools Teacher of the Year.
- St. James teachers Ms. Kristen Rogers and Mrs. Jeanna Johnson have been accepted as presenters at the 2014 *High Schools that Work* National Summer Staff Development Conference in July.
- The school's journalism program continues to grow; it now features a daily television broadcast, website, and a monthly magazine *Shark Attack*. In April, the *Shark Attack* staff published an edition enhanced with special, augmented-reality media features.
- Both the *Future Business Leaders of America* and *Virtual Enterprise* programs continue to excel at the local, state, and national levels. Rising senior Alyssa Koziarski was elected to serve as President of the South Carolina FBLA, and senior Hunter Brown and a team of international students won 2nd place in the 2014 Global Business Challenge.
- The St. James High School Academic Team once again qualified for the NAQT National Academic Team Championship Tournament by virtue of their runner-up finish in the Horry County Schools Academic Olympics. This is the third time in four years that the team has been invited to this prestigious tournament.
- The Pride of St. James High School Marching band once again qualified to participate in the state championship tournament. During the season, the band received numerous superior ratings and top rankings in a number of categories.
- The St. James High School Drama Department competed in both the Horry County and South Carolina Theatre Festivals. The spring musical production of *Fame* received stellar reviews and was seen by over 1,600 people during it's four day run.
- The Saint James Army Junior ROTC unit continued to amass numerous awards and distinctions, including the title of *Grand Champions* at the regional drill competition. The cadets' academic competition squad also placed in the top 10 nationally!
- 10 St. James Senior Shark Athletes signed national letters of intent to continue their athletic careers as studentathletes at a number of colleges and universities.
- The Boy's Golf Team claimed an unexpected victory at the South Carolina Lower State Championship Tournament in May.
- Sophomore tennis player, Jeffery Dayton once again qualified for the state tournament. His coach, Lee Cannon, was named Region Coach of the Year, leading his team to their first-ever appearance in the state tournament.
- In just their second year of existence, the varsity Competition Cheer squad placed 2nd in the South Carolina Lower State competition and 8th overall at the state level.

Measuring our Achievements

While there is no definitive way to identify a high-performing high school, accountability guidelines developed by the state of South Carolina and the federal government do give us a useful way to measure our achievements. At Saint James we have adopted the following performance goals to help us reach our school's full potential.
