First in Math Program

First in Math is a computerized program that allows children to practice math problems at a variety of levels. Since its launch date in early September, students in grades Pre-K through fifth have solved 2.465.181 math problems and have earned 821,727 stickers for completion of assignments. Each team competes for stickers earned and solving higher-level problems. Each

morning the school announces the *Player of the Day*, and that child receives a prize. Each week the *Player of the Week* and top team are recognized with a gold trophy. Out of the 58 schools who currently use *First in Math* in SC, Ridgeland Elementary is currently ranked
