Spotlight on Reading

This year our students have taken the Istation Reading assessment in September and every month since then. Scores in Overall Reading Ability, Phonics (younger grades), Alphabetic Decoding (younger grades), Comprehension, Vocabulary, and Text Fluency have been analyzed by teachers on an ongoing basis and the teachers and staff have used these scores to remediate and enhance student learning. Our goal is to reduce the percentage of students in the "red zone" or well-below grade level in reading. From September to April the percentage of students scoring in the "red zone" is: Child Development: 15% reduced from 31%

Kindergarten: 19% reduced from 32%
First Grade: 19% reduced from 32%
Second Grade: 45% reduced from 65%
Third Grade: 33% reduced from 48%
Fourth Grade: 65% reduced from 69%
Fifth Grade: 50% reduced from 65%
