Hall of Fame Inductees

Ben Connell – HS National Champion Wrestler, Since 2016, Ben has served with distinction as an elected member on Kershaw County Council furthering those same ends.

Mrs. Laurie S. Funderburk - Was appointed by the Biden Administration to serve as the State Executive Director of the USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in South Carolina in October 2021.

SGM Thomas Patrick Payne - Served 17 combat deployments. On September 11, 2020, SGM Payne was awarded by the President of the United States with a Congressional Medal of Honor in recognition of his brave actions during a rescue operation in October of 2015.

Dr. Lori M. Pindar - Earned a PhD from Clemson University, where she currently serves as the director of undergraduate studies for the Department of Communication

LTCol. Sean Quigley, Ret. - Served 23 years as an officer in the United States Marine Corps after graduating from the US Naval Academy in 1993. In May 2009, he received the Presidential Volunteer Service Award for outstanding volunteer service at St. William of York School in Stafford, VA.

Willie Mickle (Road Dedication) - Began working at Lugoff Elgin High School when the school opened in 1971. After serving as the athletic director and then as assistant principal, he became the head principal in 1978 and served in that position until 1992. While working at LEHS, he formed the first Lugoff Elgin football team.



Academic Programs

Academic Cohort of Excellence (ACE)

- One of approximately 2,000 schools worldwide to implement the AP Capstone Diploma™ program—an innovative program that encourages students to develop skills for college and career success, including critical thinking, research, collaboration, and communication.
- The program consists of two yearlong courses taken in sequence: AP® Seminar and AP Research.
- The Academic Cohort of Excellence (ACE) is a program designed to encourage motivated students to achieve more academically than they thought possible. There are three components to ACE.
- The first component is academic, the second is service, and the third is leadership.

Co-Teaching

- Teachers will provide small-group math and English instruction to aid the regular Special Education Teacher.

• Innovative program developed to help students who are more than one (current 1st year students) or two (all other students) semesters behind their peers.

Link Crew

- Link Crew is a high school transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their high school experience.
- Built on the belief that students can help students succeed, Boomerang Project's proven high school transition program trains mentors from your junior and senior classes to be Link Crew Leaders.
- As positive role models, Link Crew Leaders are mentors and student leaders who guide the freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful during the transition to high school and help facilitate freshman success.

Lugoff-Elgin Academy for Discipline (LEAD)

• Academic program created to serve as an intermediate step for students that would normally be recommended for expulsion for some infractions that violate the Kershaw County School District disciplinary regulations.

Spark

- A 3-week summer transition camp intended to assist identified rising 9th graders who may benefit from front-loading high school ready skills through Project Read, math reteaching, College and Career Ready activities, soft skills, SEL, and overall acclimation to high school before the start of the school year begins.
- Before and after school tutoring will be available for students as identified by data. Tutoring will be available in ELA/Math or any class needed for graduation credit. Check and Connect will be used as a research-based intervention for students.
- Students who complete the entire program will receive a HS 101 credit.
