

School Improvement Council Goals and Progress for 2019-2020

Goal One: Students in grades 2-5 will score proficient (on grade level) or above in reading and math.

 Title I funds were used to implement the STEAM Lab Students in grades 5K-5th participated in hands-on activities to enhance critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication skills. Based on the NWEA's 2015 Linking Study, we saw an increase in student achievement on MAP reading and math from Spring 2019 to Winter 2020.Students scoring Meets and Exceeds in reading increased from 34.8% to 40.8% and math scores increased from 47.9% to 61.2%.

Goal Two: To provide opportunities to increase parent/family Involvement and promote "Parents as Partners".

- Based on the most recent Report Card Parent Opinion Survey, eighty-one percent of parents are satisfied with the learning environment.
- The SIC continued to maintain a "Parents as Partners" area in the school to provide information and materials to assist parents, also parents may leave comments and suggestions in the suggestion box. Parents participated in PTO and SIC meetings, and they attended school sponsored events to increase parent/family involvement.
- We sponsored activities such as Donuts for Dads, Morning with Moms, Grandparents' Day, Veterans/Literacy Day and First Grade Candy Cottage Night to promote family and community involvement.
- Our school continued to use school and class newsletters, school website, social media, and School Messenger to keep parents informed and involved.
