Principal's Vision



Plans for 2024-2025

Title I

Literacy will remain a focus through the monitoring and adjustment of a comprehensive literacy plan, which includes the RTI (Response to Intervention) approach. The plan will ensure continuity for all grade levels and subjects.

MTSS

We have extended our Multi-tiered Support Systems (MTSS) interventions to include afterschool tutoring. The program focuses on specific skills in reading and in math.

Math Intervention

We will continue to provide intervention through MTSS and classroom intervention in conjunction with district math coaches. Teachers will continue using best practices, such as blended learning and station rotations as well as appropriate virtual instruction as needed.

Improve ELA and math growth with an emphasis on rigor

- Implementing math and ELA curriculum with fidelity to target student growth and tailor instruction and remediation to meet students' needs
- Administering MAP tests to all students three times per year, to identify and monitor strengths/weaknesses in ELA and Mathematics
- Teachers collaborating weekly in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to analyze and review data to drive best instructional practices
- Provide student-centered professional development during school-based Professional Learning Opportunities
