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School Improvement Goals

Improve ELA and math growth with an emphasis on rigor

- Implementing Edmentum (i.e., Exact Path, Study Island) to target student growth and tailor instruction and remediation to meet students' needs
- Administering MAP tests to all students three times to identify and monitor strengths/weaknesses in ELA and Mathematics
- Teachers collaborating weekly in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to analyze and review data to drive best instructional practices

Improve performance of students with special needs in all academic areas

- Ensuring that IEPs are written based on individualized student needs
- Utilizing testing data to individualize instruction
- Providing mainstreaming opportunities through co-teaching

Improve response to students' social and emotional needs

- Assessing students' social and emotional well-being via mental health survey (e.g., Google Form)
- Identifying students who require social and emotional support, especially as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., mentoring, counseling, small group intervention, etc.)
- Connecting students to social, emotional and mental health resources
- Assisting students as they re-enter the physical school building)

Plans for 2020-2021

Literacy Plan

Literacy will remain a focus through the monitoring and adjustment of a comprehensive literacy plan, which includes the RTI (Response to Intervention) approach. The plan will ensure continuity for all grade levels and subjects.

MTSS Implementation: Gifted and Talented Curriculum Delivery Changes

Multi-tiered Support Systems are being implemented to support and meet the needs of all students, regardless of achievement levels. KCSD is redefining how gifted instruction is delivered. Students have the opportunity to enroll in an array of gifted programming.

One-to-One Technology Implementation

We will continue the implementation digital convergence framework as prescribed by KCSD. Teachers will continue using best practices, such as blended learning and station rotations as well as appropriate virtual instruction as needed.
